## WEEK BEFORE YOU PLAN TO GO CLAMMING:

☐ Check a local tide chart to make sure you plan your clamming €	expedition around low tide.
☐ Check with RI Department of Environmental Management to make sure the area you are planning to go clamming in is open for harvest. ☐ Purchase any gear you might need (see Clamming Gear list below	ow)
☐ If you are <u>not</u> a Rhode Island resident, purchase a clamming license from your local bait & tackle shop or through DEM.
