

Shellfishing for FUN!

The following checklist is designed to help ensure you are well prepared to harvest your own clams in Rhode Island safely and effectively. WEEK BEFORE YOU PLAN TO GO CLAMMING:

- □ Check a local tide chart to make sure you plan your clamming expedition around low tide.
- Check with RI Department of Environmental Management to make sure the area you are planning to go clamming in is open for harvest. The RI DEM Shellfish info page is available at: <u>http://www.dem.ri.gov/programs/water/shellfish/</u> or call 401-222-2900
- Durchase any gear you might need (see Clamming Gear list below)
- □ If you are <u>not</u> a Rhode Island resident, purchase a clamming license from your local bait & tackle shop or through DEM.

DAY OF CLAMMING:

- □ Confirm that weather and tides are favorable
- □ Pack a lunch & water
- □ Get gear/supplies together
- □ Confirm with RI DEM that area is open (i.e. no rainfall closure) by calling DEM at 401-222-2900

CLAMMING GEAR:

□ License. If RI resident, bring driver's license	\Box Comfortable clothes that can get wet
□ Rhode Island Tide chart	□ Proper foot ware: Water shoes, strapped sandals, sneakers
\Box Cooler with ice packs (for the harvested shellfish)	Hat
□ Harvesting tool(s): Clamming rake, hand trowel, plunger	□ Sunscreen & bug spray
□ Measuring gauge	□ Sun glasses
\Box Lanyard or case for license and measuring gauge	□ Change of clothes, towel
□ Clamming basket with floats	□ Lunch/snacks/water
□ Gloves
